DEVELOPING GOALS FOR YOUR DAIRY BUSINESS

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We never plan to fail, we just fail to plan! Developing goals give us something to work toward, even if conditions change. The top performers in DBAP, dairy business analysis program, in 1995 averaged \$14.60 in accrual cash operating costs in a difficult year when average costs were \$16.51. The average revenues were \$16.76 on the 27 dairies that participated in the business analysis program. More dairies would certainly improve the reliability and accuracy.

Note that these are operating expenses, not total expenses. Other costs are interest, insurance, miscellaneous, etc. Not included are depreciation, principle payments on liabilities or any operator withdrawals or family living expenses.
